WHAT TO EXPECT

A minimum of 80 instructional/didactic hours and 80 clinical/practicum hours are required to meet Pathways Community HUB Institute (PCHI) training standards.

Trainings are completed in four weeks: the first and last weeks are in-classroom, and the second and third weeks consist of practicum hours. Classroom hours are generally 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; the course instructor will notify trainees of schedule changes.
