## WHAT TO EXPECT

A minimum of 80 instructional/didactic hours and 80 clinical/practicum hours are required to meet Pathways Community HUB Institute (PCHI) training standards.

Training is completed in five weeks, on Mondays and Tuesdays, in person at Great Rivers United Way. Classroom hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The course instructor will notify trainees of schedule changes. Limited space available.
