WHAT TO EXPECT

A minimum of 80 instructional/didactic hours and 80 clinical/practicum hours are required to meet Pathways Community HUB Institute (PCHI) training standards.

Training is seven weeks long. Classes will be held two days per week from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at Western Technical College, with a hybrid in person/virtual option in the fall. Limited space is available.

COST

Tuition is \$2,500 and includes instruction, assistance, and access to Western student resources for the duration of training.


